Why are Premier's blades smooth (have no ribs)?

Blades without ribs are lighter, thinner, smoother and easier to keep clean and oiled (and therefore less likely to have rust).

So why do Lister® blades have ribs?

Lister feels that ribs on their lower blades enable the blade to "bend" correctly. Given the steel's thickness and the tiny amount of spring tension applied to the blades that claim defies logic. We've tested similar blades with and without ribs. They cut equally well.

Do Premier's clipper blades fit Lister® machines?

Absolutely. Just as Heiniger® clipping blades will interchange with Oster® and Aesulap® blades, so do Premier's blades interchange with Lister blades.

That in mind, here's how they differ:

- Premier's plastic drive is made with a stronger plastic.
- Our plastic drive is blue (vs. black).
- Premier's top blade weighs 30% less (to reduce vibration).
- Premier's blades cost less.
- Premier's lower blade is smooth on the back instead of ribbed.
