

## WATERER TIPS

- Keep the waterer level. This enables the internal float (if applicable) to work properly—and prevents water overflowing onto the floor or soil.
- Clean the waterer often. Hard-water deposits, algae, or debris may block valves.
- Place waterers above ground level on concrete blocks, bricks, a Chick Tray (p. 25) or Chick Stand (at right). Birds are less likely to foul the water when scratching near it.
- If using outside, change waterer's location often to prevent mud holes forming.
- Do not place waterers in the sun—a shaded location reduces the amount of evaporation and keeps the water cool.
